

Chlamydia Screening in Women (CHL)

Measure Description

The percentage of women 16–24 years of age who were identified as sexually active and who had at least one test for chlamydia during the measurement year.

Numerator Compliance

At least one chlamydia test during the measurement year.

Best Practices

- ★ Incorporate universal screening of all members in this age range.
- **Screen** should occur with or without symptoms.
- Screen if oral contraceptives, sexually transmitted diseases (STD)/ sexually transmitted infections (STI) or urinary symptoms are discussed.
- we phone, email, or other means to have patients come in for their routine yearly visit.
